 1/06On this ICANSPELL WORDS list, there are more short a words. This means the a in every word sounds like the a you hear when you say "bat."

The $a$ is a vowel. Like all vowels (ae iou and $y$ sometimes) you open your mouth and pronounce it at the back of your throat. Any letter that you pronounce at the front of your mouth by closing it in some way is not a vowel-it is a consonant.

In a one-vowel word that ends in a consonant, the vowel will almost always say its short sound. If you see a short new word with a consonant at the end, try this idea. Count the vowels-if there is just one, say the vowel the short way.

On a piece of paper draw three really thin
columns, like this: $|||\mid$ all the way down the
page. Print your spelling words in the columns,
making sure the $a$ is in the middle one, like
this: $|w| a|x|$. Colour all the vowels yellow. Now
take a ruler and cover all the letters left of
the a's, and read the new words. Do they all
sound like they have short a's?
